The Angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. Pray, Read, Reflect, Pray

How to use this booklet

Through Advent, try to immerse yourself in the remarkable words of Mary in response to God's calling on her life. Each day will focus on one segment and we suggest you approach it as follows:

Pray for the Lord to help you engage with the Scripture

Read the passage on the front page, then the segment for the day

Reflect on it using the questions provided to help you. You might like to use the back of the booklet to write down your thoughts.

Pray again into your own situation and for God's work through us at St Andrew's Church. Use the prayer below to close.

Prayer

Thursday 30th November: Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word."

Why do I think Mary accepted this difficult challenge?
When have I been surprised by something God has done in my life?
How did I respond?
What about it scared me?

Pray for courage to listen and accept God's call, for direction for our work at St Andrew's.

Friday 1st December: My soul MAGNIFIES the Lord

How did this task magnify the Lord through Mary? How have I seen the Lord magnified in my life? What difference did it make? What is the Lord asking me to do about it?

Pray that God will be magnified through us, for St Andrew's to bring His mission to life.

Saturday 2nd December: And my spirit REJOICES in God my Saviour

Why did Mary feel such joy?
What has God done that brings me joy?
Who else is affected by my joy?
How can I share it with others?

Pray with thanks for the joy that God brings, for St Andrew's to reflect the joy of the Lord in our community.

Sunday 3rd December: For he has looked with FAVOUR

How might Mary have felt being singled out like this? When has the Lord looked with favour on me? What was it like? How did I thank Him?

Pray for the Lord to look with favour upon us and upon the work of St Andrew's.

Monday 4th December: on the LOWLINESS of his servant

What does Mary's humility tell me about her character? When have I felt not good enough for God? What does this word show me about God's attitude towards me? How should I respond?

Pray for grace to know that God loves us just as we are. That our lowly church may know and understand its significance in God's plan.

Tuesday 5th December: Surely, from now on all generations will call me BLESSED

How was Mary right about the generations calling her blessed?

When have I felt God's blessing upon me?

Where did that blessing take me?

How can I share it with others?

Pray with thanks for God's blessing, that the Lord will bless the work of St Andrew's.

Join us for Daily Prayer on Zoom at 12.30pm

Wednesday 6th December: For the Mighty One has done GREAT THINGS for me

What great things did God do for Mary?

What is the greatest thing God has done for me?

What difference did it make in my life?

How did (or will) I share it?

Pray that God will continue to do great things in our lives and in the life and work of St Andrew's.

Join us for Morning Prayer on Zoom at 8.00am

Thursday 7th December: And HOLY is his name

How does Mary see God's holiness?

Where do I see God's holiness and how does it touch me?

Where do I need to share it with others?

Pray for the holiness of the Lord to fill our lives and spill out into His work through us.

Join us for Evening Prayer on Zoom at 5.30pm

Friday 8th December: His **MERCY** is for those who **FEAR** him from generation to generation

What does this tell us about Mary's knowledge of God?

When have I needed God's mercy?

What does fear of the Lord look like for me?

Who do I know that needs to hear this?

Pray for someone who needs to know God's mercy. For us as a church to know it too.

Saturday 9th December: He has shown STRENGTH with his arm

How does Mary lean on the strength of the Lord?

How have I leaned on the strength of the Lord?

What did that feel like?

Where do I need to rely on God's strength today?

Pray for God's strength in our weakness. For the strength to face up to difficult decisions at St Andrew's.

Sunday 10th December: He has scattered the **PROUD** in the **THOUGHTS** of their **HEARTS**

How did Mary keep pride from getting in the way? What does this say about the effect of pride on my wellbeing? When have I allowed pride to get in the way of God's will? How can I keep pride from the thoughts of my heart?

Pray for the grace to live with humility. That the thoughts of our hearts at St Andrew's will show the glory of God and not our own pride.

Monday 11th December: He has brought down the **POWERFUL** from their thrones

What powers might have been at play in Mary's life at that time?

Where have I seen an abuse of power?

When might I have been tempted to abuse my own power?

When have I handed my power to the Lord for Him to use?

Pray that the power of God may be greater than our own as we fulfil His work in North Swindon

Tuesday 12th December: And LIFTED UP the LOWLY

How might Mary have felt uplifted?
How have I felt uplifted by God?
How can I fulfil God's mandate to lift up the lowly?

Pray with thanks for God's uplifting care. That we at St Andrew's may know how to model God's uplifting.

Join us for Daily Prayer on Zoom at 12.30pm

Wednesday 13th December: He has FILLED the HUNGRY with good things

What experience might Mary have had with hunger?
When have I felt that my hunger has been satisfied by God?
Who do I know that hungers and how am I being called to provide?

Pray:that those who hunger will be filled with good things, to know how we at St Andrew's can help God's mission to the hungry.

Join us for Morning Prayer on Zoom at 8.00am

Thursday 14th December: And sent the RICH away empty

What does this tell me about Mary's attitude to earthly riches? What riches have I been blessed with and how do I share them? What would it feel like to be rich, but empty without God's love?

Pray: that God will guide us both personally at as Church to share the riches we have.

Join us for Evening Prayer on Zoom at 5.30pm

Friday 15th December: He has **HELPED** his servant Israel in **REMEMBRANCE** of his mercy

What might Mary have learned of God's help to the Israelites? When have I known that God has remembered me and those I love? Where do I feel I need God's help right now? How do we need God's help at St Andrew's?

Pray: that God may remember us in his mercy, in our lives and in our work at St Andrew's.

Saturday 16th December: According to the **PROMISES** he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants **FOR EVER**

How would Mary have known of God's promises? How does Jesus fulfil God's promises then, now and in the future? Where have I seen God's promises in my life? What does it mean to have God's promises for ever?

Pray: for the fulfilment of God's promises in our lives, in the life and work of St Andrew's, and for generations to come.
